
What is Agile, what are some of its principles and why is it so fundamentally crucial for the project management and software development teams.

Design thinking, learn the process and develop abilities to think like a designer: Empathize, Define, Ideate, Prototype, Test.

Agile is an approach to software development that seeks the continuous delivery of working software created in rapid iterations. It is a way of thinking about collaboration and workflows and it is a set of values which guide our choices in regards to what we make and how we make it.

The Design Thinking workshop is a Red Hat facilitated workshop where multiple teams create and prototype user-centered designs. Unlike lectures or presentations, Design Thinking workshops are used when teams want to arrive at a user-centered solution while working together. Each team will be randomly created, each team will have a Red Hatter there to support them.
