


Chomsky's Language Adventures

In this edition of Chomsky's Language Adventures, Chomsky goes to English school but still wants to speak Martian.




Many children who speak more than one language are scared that it will be hard for them to make friends at school because they are different. Chomsky is going to show you that speaking two languages means that you can make even more friends!






Chomsky finds Spanish class in his new school a lot easier than he thought. This is because he can already speak two languages. Knowing more than one language makes it easier to learn new ones!
