The YPAG NE launch event is taking place at the Great North Children's Hospital, Newcastle upon Tyne on Thursday 17th September 2015 from 18:00



- Young Person's Advisory Group (YPAG)
 consists of six groups across England. We
 are the YPAG North England and join with
 groups in Liverpool, Birmingham, London,
 Bristol and Nottingham
- We are made up of young people aged between 11 and 18 years of age who live in the North of England
- We meet monthly on a Thursday night in the Great North Children's Hospital
- We make sure research is young people friendly
- We help researchers with their projects
- We raise research awareness amongst young people
- We talk at conferences about young people's health and research
- Meetings are informal most of all we have fun and meet new people




Who can be involved?
